

## Storefront Improvement Grant Guidelines

Improving local storefronts

## **APPLICATION MUST BE PRE-APPROVED**

- A. Purpose
  - 1. To improve the storefront presentation
  - 2. To assist local business and property owners in reducing the cost of capital improvements that increase the visual appeal of a building

## B. Goals

- 1. To improve the visual appearance of storefronts in Cavalier
- 2. To incentivize continued revitalization of Cavalier's business district
- 3. To encourage new businesses to relocate to vacant buildings
- 4. To lower the cost of property improvements for business owners
- 5. To assist businesses in expanding their customer base
- C. Overview
  - 1. Matching grant of up to \$3,000, but no more than 20% of the cost of improving business's storefront
  - 2. Cavalier city council determines grant awardees by a majority vote
  - 3. Applicants must have a valid ND sales and use tax permit, if applicable
  - 4. Applicants must be either commercial property owners
  - 5. Proof of property ownership or lease terms may be required in order to process the grant application
  - 6. Disbursement of grant award will occur after the approved project is completed and all applicable receipts are submitted
  - 7. All work must be completed within one (1) year of the application being approved unless prior authorization is received
  - 8. Approved improvements must be maintained for at least three (3) years or the grant dollars may be recalled
  - 9. The City of Cavalier may request a review of the applicable improvements by a certified code enforcer at the expense of the applicant prior to finalizing the grant award
  - 10. A business and/or property owner can receive the grant once every five (5) years with a maximum lifetime award of \$7,000
    - i. If the property or business is sold or rented, the new proprietor is fully eligible for the grant with the lifetime award being reset
  - 11. Work shall not commence prior to application approval
  - 12. Purchases must be made in Cavalier unless prior authorization is received
  - 13. Sales tax dollars are not reimbursable
- D. Eligible activities include but are not limited to
  - 1. External doors or windows
  - 2. Awnings or canopies
  - 3. Signs
  - 4. Permanent outdoor lighting
  - 5. Paint
  - 6. Reconfiguration of entrances
